

Notice is hereby given pursuant to the requirements of Section 403(r) (6) (21 U.S.C. 343 (r) (6)) of the Federal Food, Drug, and Cosmetic Act and in accordance with the requirements of 21 C.F.R. 101.93, that M.D. Labs, P.O. TEXT OF CLAIM

DHEA 100 (dehydroepiandrosterone) is one of the most popular fitness products on the market. DHEA is considered to be an adrenal androgen but actually can be converted into many other steroid hormones. DHEA, the most abundant hormone in the human body, has been shown to be a marker of aging. DHEA levels peak around the age of 25 yrs., & gradually decrease to only about 5% of original levels by age 80.
