WARNING LETTER

Dear Mr. Yu:

Inspection of your noodle manufacturing plant, located at 400 Northeast 67th Street, Miami, Florida, on November 2, 3, and 7, 1997, by FDA Investigator Jennifer M. Donzanti, revealed the production, labeling, and wholesale distribution of assorted noodle products to the restaurant trade. Our review of your product labels for Fried Wontons, Steamed Noodles, and Chow Mein Noodles, reveal that these products are in violation of the Federal Food, Drug, and Cosmetic Act (the Act), and the food labeling regulations in Title 21, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 101 (21 CFR 101).

The products are misbranded within the meaning of Section 403(i)(2) of the Act in that they are fabricated from two or more ingredients, but the labels fail to bear the common or usual name of each ingredient in the products as required by 21 CFR 101.4(a)(1). The Fried Wonton and Steamed Noodle products are further misbranded in that they contain the color additives FD&C Yellow No. 5, FD&C Yellow No. 6, and FD&C Red No. 40, but the certified color additives fail to be declared by specific name on the product labels in the list of ingredients as required by 21 CFR 101.22(k)(1).

The above violations concern certain new labeling requirements and are not intended to be an all-inclusive list of deficiencies regarding products labeled by your firm. As owner, it is your responsibility to ensure that all food products produced, labeled, and distributed by your firm are in compliance with the Act and the food labeling regulations. You should take prompt action to correct these violations. Failure to correct these violations may result in regulatory action, including seizure and/or injunction, without further notice.

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We request that you notify this office in writing, within 15 working days of the receipt of this letter, of specific steps you have taken to correct these violations. If corrections cannot be completed within 15 working days, state the reason for the delay and the time frame within which corrections will be completed.
