Dear Mr. King:

The U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) inspected your food storage warehouse facility, located at the above address, on March 30 through April 6, 2001. During the inspection, our investigators documented numerous insanitary conditions, which causes the food products stored at your facility to become adulterated. The adulterated food products are in violation of Section 402(a)(4) of the Federal Food, Drug, and Cosmetic Act (the Act), in that they have been held under insanitary conditions whereby they may have become contaminated with filth.

Evidence of rodent activity was observed on and near foods stored in your warehouse. This evidence included rodent excreta pellets and rodent urine stains. Evidence of rodent gnawing was observed on several bags of rice. Our FDA laboratory confirmed the findings of rodent excreta pellets sampled from your facility during the inspection.

Our inspection of the general storage conditions in the warehouse revealed an opened unused receiving dock door; gaps of approximately ¼ to ½ inches wide around the sides and bottom of the dock door when closed, and areas holding excessive amounts of unused packaging materials near food products.

Other conditions documented during the inspection include observations of live birds and bird excreta droppings on and near foods stored in your facility; products such as soybeans, rice noodles and dried fungus stored in open containers; and a broken freezer door with excessive ice buildup inside and outside the freezer, which contains frozen seafood products.

The above is not intended to be an all-inclusive list of deficiencies at your facility. You are responsible for assuring that your facility is operated in a sanitary manner, and that products

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you store and distribute are in compliance with the law. At the conclusion of the inspection our investigators issued a Form FDA 483, Inspectional Observations, to Mr. Richard Shaw, General Manager. A copy is enclosed for your information.


You should know that this serious violation of the law may result in FDA taking regulatory action without further notice to you. These actions include, but are not limited to, seizure and/or obtaining a court injunction against further distribution of your food products.

We received a letter dated April 11, 2001 from Mr. Shaw, which is his response to the Form FDA 483 observations. Mr. Shaw's letter was reviewed and taken into account as we prepared this letter. The corrections promised in his letter will have to be verified by inspection.

It is necessary for you to take action on this matter now. Please let this office know in writing within fifteen (15) working days from the date you received this letter what steps, in addition to those mentioned in Mr. Shaw's letter, you are taking to correct the problems. We also ask that you explain how you plan to prevent these violations from happening again. If you need more time, let us know why and when you expect to complete your correction.
