WARNING LETTER

Dear Mr. Caler:

On August 7, 1997, a representative of the Food and Drug Administration conducted an inspection of your servicing aircraft facility at Washington National Airport, Washington, DC. This inspection was conducted under the authority of the Public Health Service Act and the Federal Food, Drug, and Cosmetic Act.

The List of Observations (FDA-483) was issued to and discussed with Mr. Timothy Guthrie, Maintenance Foreman. A copy of the FDA-483 is enclosed for your reference.

The inspection revealed significant deviations from the Interstate Conveyance Regulations [21 CFR 1250], as follows:

- 1) Lavatory service truck #90 was leaking sewage and sanitizer from the dump valve onto the rampway.
- 2) All three service trucks have sewage spilled on the outside of the truck and into the truck service panels.

As a result of these findings, this facility has been classified as "Provisional." A reinspection will be conducted on or about September 7, 1997, to determine if future classification will be "Approved" or "Not Approved." A "Not Approved" classification means you cannot provide water/sewage service to airlines.

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Please advise this office in writing, within 15 days of receipt of this letter, regarding actions taken to correct the deficiencies and to assure that such violative conditions will not recur.
