




Live learners scored higher than online learners.





RNs have lower posttest scores than prescribers.






Learners with individual DEA registration score higher.

Learners demonstrated improvement in confidence in challenging content areas.

REAL SOCO*RE data on challenging topics.

	# Attempts	% Correct	Δ Confidence
Opioid Rotation (what is the new analgesic dose?)	2.5	77%	36%
Using the ORT OUD (is this patient at risk for OUD?)	1.5	78%	36%



Learners made more changes than they thought they would.

Outcomes Level	Patient Assessment	Create Treatment Plan	Manage on Opioids	Educate	OUD
Level 4: Competence (% indicating their intent to change)	25%	19%	15%	17%	13%
Level 5: Practice Change – Survey (% indicating they made changes, n=181)	44%	39%	23%	37%	25%
Level 5: Practice Change – Interviews (% Δ in practice behaviors before vs after the activity, n=22)	12%	33%	-1%	6%	0%



What are the implications for opioid REMS education going forward?

- A Common Outcomes Framework is critical to measuring effectiveness
- Online learning is even more important with the pandemic
- REAL CO*RE taught us that adaptive learning works
- RNs need additional support (adapting to their SOP?)
- The most effective education is driven by data
