Thank you for your telephone call this late afternoon in which you informed me that the FDA needs more time to complete the review on the above-referenced qualified green tea health claim application. You also informed me that the new date set for the final decision on this claim application is June 30, 2005, and that at this time there is no need for me to offer any additional materials or for me to meet with the reviewing officers at the FDA in person to answer any questions related to this application.

My interest is to work with the FDA in constructing a science-based health claim to be used as food labeling for a special grade of green tea that will guide the consumers in choosing their tea drinks to manage their own health. When the health-conscious consumers become better educated, the tea industry will find a way to provide higher quality teas to meet their demands. The most effective way in teaching is to do good work for others to observe and to imitate. That is what I am trying to accomplish in setting an example for the tea industry.
