On this date around 2005 hrs I was dispatched to the above mentioned location regarding an ambulance request. A [redacted] was dehydrated and needed assistance.

ARRIVAL:

Upon arrival, around 2013 hrs, I advised dispatch that [redacted] and fire rescue were on the scene. I then walked to the [redacted] room area but did not see any one. I then walked down to the [redacted] locker room and observed [redacted] staff providing medical attention to the [redacted]. The assistant coach, [redacted] who was also in the locker room identified the [redacted] as a [redacted]. I then interviewed [redacted].

INTERVIEW WITH [redacted]

[redacted] stated [redacted] was up in the [redacted] room sauna sweating off pounds to lose weight. [redacted] stated [redacted] was in and out of the sauna periodically from around 1530 hrs until he became dehydrated.

[redacted] stated during his personal work out session in the [redacted] room he would periodically see [redacted] go in and out of the sauna. [redacted] stated [redacted] left the sauna and they both began to walk down to the locker room to check his weight.

[redacted] stated while walking down to the locker room he could see that [redacted] was dehydrated. [redacted] stated while they were in the hall way, that leads to the locker room, [redacted] leaned on the wall for support. [redacted] stated he then assisted [redacted] into the locker room and sat him down on the bench.

[redacted] stated once on the bench he then assisted [redacted] with taking off his sweat suit. [redacted] stated [redacted] was wearing a rubber sweat suit underneath a cotton sweat suit. [redacted] stated after [redacted] clothing was removed [redacted] then walked over to the digital scale (located in the corner of the locker room) to weigh himself.

[redacted] stated he observed [redacted] on the scale and he noticed his legs were shivering. [redacted] stated [redacted] then got off the scale and walked back over to the bench and sat down. [redacted] stated he walked over to [redacted] and offered him some gatorade, but he refused. [redacted] stated he then handed [redacted] a glass of water and then he asked him if he was alright.

[redacted] stated he then ran out to the [redacted] area to called 911

[REDACTED] stated when he returned to the locker room he discovered [REDACTED] had left the bench and started crawling towards the scale area. [REDACTED] stated he then layed [REDACTED] down on his back and checked for a pulse. [REDACTED] stated he could feel a faint pulse. He then placed his head on [REDACTED] chest and heard a steady fast heart beat. [REDACTED] stated several minutes later he heard what he believed to be the ambulance pull up to the [REDACTED] entrance. [REDACTED] stated he the ran up to the [REDACTED] to let them in and direct them to the locker room. [REDACTED] stated he also called the head coach [REDACTED]. I then briefly interviewed coach [REDACTED] when he arrived at [REDACTED].

INTERVIEW WITH COACH [REDACTED]

COACH stated [REDACTED] was a junior on the 1997-98 [REDACTED] team and he [REDACTED] was in the process of losing weight to [REDACTED] at 153 pounds. COACH stated because [REDACTED] was over the target weight of 153 pounds he asked [REDACTED] if he could get down to that amount. COACH stated the team had left town for a [REDACTED] meet on Thursday 12-04-97 and (through a mutual agreement between [REDACTED] and the coaching staff) they left [REDACTED] home in [REDACTED] to lose the weight.

COACH stated they did not return until Monday 12-08-97 during the morning. COACH stated during the time they were gone he does not know the work out regimen [REDACTED] was on or if he was eating properly. COACH stated [REDACTED] looked fine during practices on this date (12-09-97) and once all the other [REDACTED] made weight he took them out to eat. COACH stated [REDACTED] did not make the weight at the end of practice, so he stayed and continued to work out. COACH stated he received a telephone call from [REDACTED] to return to [REDACTED] after taking the team out to eat. It was at that time he found out [REDACTED] was having problems.

INVESTIGATION:

While [REDACTED] was providing [REDACTED] with medical attention I advised the COACH to contact [REDACTED] parents and advise them of the situation. After [REDACTED] performed advanced emergency life support on [REDACTED] in the locker room, he was transported to [REDACTED] emergency. I then transported COACH and [REDACTED] to the emergency room.

[REDACTED] emergency staff attempted to revive [REDACTED] but was unsuccessful. He was pronounced dead at 2058 hrs. Emergency room staff (Dr. [REDACTED]) and COACH made contact with [REDACTED] parents (who live in [REDACTED]).

I then contacted shift supervisor [REDACTED] and advised him of the situation. The investigation was then turned over to Sgts. [REDACTED] and [REDACTED].

At 10:15 p.m., Sgt. [redacted] contacted me and requested I respond to [redacted] regarding the sudden death of a 21 year old member of the [redacted] team.

ACTIONS TAKEN

A response was made to [redacted] and contact was made with the two [redacted] officers at that location, Sgt. [redacted] and Police Officer [redacted]

They gave the preliminary information that the [redacted] was working out in the [redacted] practice area at [redacted] when he became ill and ultimately passed out. [redacted] had been riding an exercise bike and was spending periods of time in the sauna located next to the mat room. At the time [redacted] was present with [redacted], [redacted] being the person who called 911 to request an ambulance.

A check was made of the practice area and nothing unusual was noted, other than excessive heat in the room. There are several exercise bikes, including one in the sauna. A radio in the sauna was also on and playing at the time of the check.

Sgt. [redacted] reported that at 10:11 p.m., he checked the temperature in the [redacted] room on a wall mounted thermostat and found that it read 92 degrees, the highest reading on the thermostat.

INTERVIEW WITH

[redacted] coach [redacted] responded to [redacted] and held a team meeting, after which he was interviewed at 10: 55 p.m. Also present was assistant coach [redacted], Sgt. [redacted] and Officer [redacted]

Contact was made with Coach [redacted] and Assistant Coach [redacted]. Both stated that [redacted] was attempting to lower his weight in order to [redacted]. [redacted] said that on saturday, 12/6/97, [redacted] weighed 170 pounds and since then he had lost sixteen pounds.

I asked [redacted] if athletes were monitored during periods when they were attempting to lose weight to make sure they were eating and to gauge their progress and he stated there was no formal mechanism in place to do so, and that it was not easy to monitor the athletes around the clock. He did say that it is not uncommon for [redacted] to under go similar weight loss to compete in certain [redacted] saying several have done so.

Coach [REDACTED] said he was not aware of any health problems suffered by [REDACTED] and is not aware of him taking any medications. I asked about drug screening and he stated they only test athletes for illicit drugs if abuse is suspected and [REDACTED] was not suspected of using controll substances.

INTERVIEW WITH [REDACTED]
Assistant coach [REDACTED] gave the following statement.

[REDACTED] stated that [REDACTED] attended practice which began at 3:30 p.m. and lasted approximately one hour. [REDACTED] stayed to work out further in order to lose more weight to make it down to 153 pounds.

According to [REDACTED] [REDACTED] was riding an exercise bike and using the sauna. Regarding the sauna use, [REDACTED] said that [REDACTED] was going in and out of it and was not working out exclusively in it.

[REDACTED] said that around 8:00 p.m., [REDACTED] became dizzy, so he walked him toward the locker room. At one point [REDACTED] leaned against the wall while on the way to the locker room as if he were in some type of stress.

Once in the locker room [REDACTED] helped [REDACTED] take off his sweats and a tight nylon (rubber like) suit underneath them. [REDACTED] was sitting at this time and after standing on a scale his legs started to shake, so [REDACTED] had him sit, then he got [REDACTED] some Gatorade and when [REDACTED] refused that, some water. [REDACTED] also put a wet towel over [REDACTED] head to cool him.

[REDACTED] stated [REDACTED] left the bench and got on his hands and knees on the floor, then rolled onto his back. [REDACTED] said [REDACTED] eyes were glazed he was unresponsive. He checked his breathing and pulse and after finding both he left to call 911 on the payphone in the [REDACTED] of [REDACTED]. After making the call he returned and found [REDACTED] still unresponsive but did find a pulse and that he was breathing. [REDACTED] said until the ambulance arrived he was able to detect breathing and a pulse on [REDACTED] and he stayed with [REDACTED] until the ambulance untimately transported him to the hospital.

According to [REDACTED] preliminary test results show that [REDACTED] potassium levels are elevated and there is evidence of possible kidney damage. [REDACTED] further stated that these are possible indicators of severe dehydration.

I advised her of the reported recent rapid weight loss and the heat and exertion victim experienced from 3:30 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. on 12-09-97, and she noted that the results returning are consistent with what would be expected from victim being exposed to those conditions and having that weight loss.

[REDACTED] was interviewed at 1:00 p.m. on 12-11-97 in Captain [REDACTED] office. He was also present during the interview.

Ms. [REDACTED] described herself as [REDACTED] girlfriend. She further said that she has known him for two years and dated him for three months. [REDACTED] stated that she last talked to [REDACTED] on Monday, 12-08-97, estimating the time as between 8:30 to 9:00 p.m. She said at that time he was in a good mood and was very talkative.

[REDACTED] added that it struck her as somewhat unusual that [REDACTED] was in such a good mood because he was "cutting weight" and in the past when he has done so he would be in poor moods when cutting weight. She said that [REDACTED] told her he weighed 172 pounds on Wednesday, 12-03-97.

[REDACTED] said she saw [REDACTED] on Friday or Saturday, 12-06 or 07-97 and she described him as looking gaunt from weight loss. As for his food intake she said she knew he had a sandwich and yogurt on Saturday, 12-6-97, and told her on Monday when they talked on the phone that he had not eaten on Monday, 12-08-97. [REDACTED] said she was unaware of his eating other than this, but did say that generally when he was cutting weight he didn't eat or drink much in order to loose pounds.

[REDACTED] said that [REDACTED] had a good attitude, and was enthusiastic about [REDACTED] and being on the [REDACTED]. She described him as [REDACTED] oriented and was glad to be able to help the team. She said he really wanted to [REDACTED] and was glad that he was asked to be put in that class. She also said he was not real upset at not making the trip to [REDACTED], that he knew he was not ready to compete. According to [REDACTED] [REDACTED] liked his coaches and got along well with them.

Regarding his habits of cutting weight, [REDACTED] said that [REDACTED] never used laxatives and did not vomit to expell extra weight, that he did not believe in that. She also said to her knowledge he never used supplements, steroids or any other controlled substance. She said he would occasionally have a beer or an alcoholic drink, describing his use as typical of a college student.

She said she was aware that he took vicodin for a neck injury he had

He was interviewed for information on [REDACTED] status on the team regarding his weight class assignments and practice and work out activities.

INTERVIEW WITH [REDACTED]

Coach [REDACTED] was interviewed at 9:00 a.m. on 12-16-97 in Captain [REDACTED] office. [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] were also present.

Coach [REDACTED] stated that [REDACTED] is a third year [REDACTED] and has approximately an 83% [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] said that initial team try outs took place November first through the tenth. According to the coach, [REDACTED] but during team try outs he lost out to team mate [REDACTED], an [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] then tried out at [REDACTED] and lost a try out at that weight to first year [REDACTED].

[REDACTED] said the team's first competition was in [REDACTED] during the weekend of December 5 and 6. [REDACTED] did not make that trip because of the losses to the other team members for those weight classes. Coach [REDACTED] said that prior to the team leaving on 12/4, he told [REDACTED] he wanted him to [REDACTED] in the [REDACTED] for the upcoming meet with [REDACTED] that was scheduled for 12/10. [REDACTED] intended to have [REDACTED] at 158 pounds in place of the first year athlete [REDACTED] and wanted [REDACTED] to [REDACTED] at 150 pounds.

Coach [REDACTED] added that he had spoken to [REDACTED] parents, particularly his mother, [REDACTED], on the previous Monday or Tuesday, and they wanted [REDACTED] to [REDACTED] at 158 pounds so he would not have to keep himself at the lower weight. (It should be noted that [REDACTED] is listed in the media guide as 150/158 pounds. [REDACTED] is listed at 150 pounds in the guide).

[REDACTED] then speculated that [REDACTED] probably waited until the last minute to begin cutting weight, saying that has been a problem with him. He likened it to a [REDACTED] who waits until the night before a test to cram. [REDACTED] said when the team was in [REDACTED] he rechecked by asking [REDACTED] room mate, to remind him on Saturday during a phone call that he was expected to [REDACTED] in the [REDACTED] for the [REDACTED].

On Tuesday, 12-09-97, the team had a light workout from 3:30 p.m. to 4:15 p.m. followed by a weigh in for the [redacted] the next day. [redacted] said that [redacted] was six pounds over weight before practice, a weight he described as not an exorbitant amount, and he speculated that [redacted] probably did not start working out to cut weight until Saturday. He also noted that [redacted] father also made a comment when he was in town that he knew that [redacted] would put off his weight loss too late.

[redacted] said the Tuesday practice consisted of light [redacted] and drills, and at approximately 4:15 p.m., then most team members would put on their sweats and the undergarments usually referred to as rubber suits (they actually are similar to a vinyl material) and ride the exercise bikes to sweat off some weight prior to being weighed in.

[redacted] said the practice was uneventful and that he was not aware of any problems with or suffered by [redacted]

[redacted] said [redacted] weighed in at 3.6 pounds over [redacted] at 156.6 pounds. At 153 pounds he would have made weight). [redacted] said that another [redacted] also was over by two pounds but made weight after working out some more. [redacted] said he left [redacted] with Assistant Coach [redacted] until [redacted] could make weight, then he left with the team for a team meal.

[redacted] stated that he will not allow a team member to compete if he is over weight and they must make it exactly within the three pound allowance. He or one of the assistants conduct the weigh ins and he will not allow a [redacted] to compete if he is over weight. The scale weighs to one tenth of a pound.

[redacted] said later after [redacted] collapsed he was contacted at his home by [redacted] who called him from [redacted]. He responded and arrived prior to [redacted] being transported to [redacted]. At that time the [redacted] responders were still administering aid to [redacted]. [redacted] responded to the hospital in a [redacted] police car driven by Officer [redacted]

[redacted] described [redacted] as a very good [redacted] stating that he was awarded the team most improved last year during a red shirt year. [redacted] added that because he was red shirted, [redacted] had to provide his own transportation and costs to attend meets.

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Regarding the rubber/vinyl suits worn by the [redacted] to enhance weight loss, [redacted] said the team does not supply them, and that the team members who have them pay for them personally. The team members are allowed to work out on their own during times that [redacted] is open. They also are required to have a minimum of one day a week off.

[redacted] said he knew of no physical problems with [redacted] and never suspected any kind of drug or substance abuse. He said [redacted] did have an injury to his neck from a meet last summer at the [redacted] games where he hit his head. [redacted] said that he believed [redacted] had been taking vicodin on a prescription from team Doctor [redacted]

[REDACTED] said he was not aware of any unusual injuries or behaviors of [REDACTED] that could have contributed to his death other than the injury he had last summer. [REDACTED] said he took vicodin for it from a prescription from Dr. [REDACTED] or Dr. [REDACTED] (name supplied by [REDACTED]).

[REDACTED] described a typical weight cutting workout as biking, alternating with sitting in the sauna for two to ten minutes. He said he did not see [REDACTED] in the sauna at all this year. [REDACTED] said the coaches monitor the use of the sauna and make the athletes come out if they feel they are in too long.

[REDACTED] said he spoke with [REDACTED] on Tuesday 12/9 and [REDACTED] told him he was two or three pounds over the weight limit at the weigh in. [REDACTED] stated that the last thing [REDACTED] said to him was that he was little over but he was going to make it and he would be home in about an hour.

He was also asked if there ever was any cheating at the weigh ins and he stated that the coaches never cheated on a weight. He said there was "definitely no cheating." [REDACTED] also said that a weight loss like the one [REDACTED] was attempting was not unusual in the sport.

[REDACTED] said that [REDACTED] wanted to [REDACTED] in [REDACTED] but lost to [REDACTED]. His only other choice was 158 but [REDACTED] believed he could compete better at 150. [REDACTED] was also aware that the coaches

At 5:00 p.m., ██████████ told him he was over weight by three pounds and that he could make it and be home in an hour.

He added that when they are cutting weight they typically take turns in the sauna, switching every five minutes with another ██████████ on a bike.

WRITTEN STATEMENT

[redacted] written statement was received by [redacted] on 12-12-97 at 6:12 p.m. by fax from the office of [redacted]. It is included within this report.

INTERVIEW WITH

Captain [redacted] and I responded to the office of attorney [redacted] at [redacted] at 6:00 p.m. on 12-16-97. [redacted] was interviewed from 6:00 p.m. to 7:39 p.m. with Mr. [redacted] present.

Coach [redacted] stated that [redacted] determines the line up for the [redacted] meets and that the team has [redacted] to determine who competes in meets. Because [redacted] was beat out in the [redacted] by [redacted], and in the [redacted], [redacted] stayed in [redacted] while the team was in [redacted]. [redacted] explained that that meet was in invitational and they could only enter one [redacted].

[redacted] said while in [redacted] he had no contact with [redacted] but he thought that [redacted] may have spoken with [redacted] by phone. [redacted] said they got back on Monday morning and he arrived at his residence at 4:30 a.m. The team had a light practice on Monday, 12/08/97, at 3:30 p.m. and on that day he was not aware of [redacted] weight.

[redacted] explained that the coaches do not train the athletes to get into shape, they generally instruct them in techniques and moves on the mat. It is the athlete's responsibility to maintain their conditioning and their weight as they all know the [redacted] that they compete in.

[redacted] stated Coach [redacted] and the assistant coaches do not tolerate cheating on weight, they must make their weight on a scale in the locker room that measures down to a tenth of a pound. [redacted] said the sport has an honor system for weigh ins and each team certifies their own athletes and he believes that generally the teams are honest about weigh ins.

[redacted] said the Monday practice consisted of fifteen minutes of warm ups and approximately 45 minutes [redacted]. He said that he was not aware of any of the team having weight problems, but stated they were all probably over their weights somewhat, that being natural in the sport, particularly after a weekend trip.

[REDACTED] said that the Wednesday (12/03/97) before the [REDACTED] trip, Coach [REDACTED] advised the team what he wanted for a line up for the [REDACTED] meet. Changes taking place were [REDACTED] at 118 pounds, [REDACTED] at 150 pounds and [REDACTED] at 158. The move of [REDACTED] opening the opportunity for [REDACTED] to [REDACTED] at 150.

[REDACTED] said weigh in day was Tuesday 12-09-97. The team had a light warm up and light practice at 3:30 p.m. The [REDACTED] wore the usual practice clothing which is shorts and t-shirts. [REDACTED] said they are not allowed to wear the vinyl suits at practice. At 5:00 p.m., weigh ins took place and [REDACTED], [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] were over the allowed weights. [REDACTED] said he was not in the locker room for the weigh ins, he was watching film in another room.

At 5:45 p.m., Coach [REDACTED] asked [REDACTED] to stay over with the three who were not at weight. The three used the stationary bikes and sauna to sweat off their weight, with [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] making weight. [REDACTED] said while the athletes were working out he was in the [REDACTED] room either watching TV or listening to a radio. At 6:30 p.m. both [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] had made weight but [REDACTED] was still 1.7 pounds over the allowed 153 pounds for his intended [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] said that [REDACTED] had been wearing the rubber suit, a top and pants under a sweat suit. He stayed with [REDACTED] while he did a rotation of riding a bike in the [REDACTED] room, spending two minutes in the sauna and then resting on the couch. [REDACTED] said he had changed into work out clothes and stayed with [REDACTED] and sat in the sauna with him. He said [REDACTED] did not use the bike in the sauna. He said that [REDACTED] was not acting lethargic or unusual and that he spoke normally about his studying and a test he had the next day.

[REDACTED] said that at 7:45 p.m. or 7:50 p.m., [REDACTED] told him he thought he was down to the required weight. They exited the [REDACTED] room and went down a stairway just outside the [REDACTED] room that leads to the hall near the locker room. Near the entrance to the locker room, [REDACTED] stopped and bent over and put his hands on his thighs and leaned against the wall as if he were fatigued, but otherwise he did not show any signs of distress.

[REDACTED] said he was behind [REDACTED] [REDACTED] continued through the open locker room door and sat on a bench. [REDACTED] said [REDACTED] took his sweat suit off and [REDACTED] helped him take the top of the rubber suit off. He explained that it is typical for the coaches to help them remove those suits. [REDACTED] said he was in front of [REDACTED] and reached over his head and back to peel it off over his head. [REDACTED] said up to this point he thought [REDACTED] was fine.

[REDACTED] then laid down on the bench and lifted his hips to remove the rubber pants and [REDACTED] again helped him peel them off and [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] sat back up. [REDACTED] had [REDACTED] wrestling team shorts and socks on and he took them off by himself.

[REDACTED] walked over to and got up on the scale by himself but upon standing on it his legs started to tremble, and because of the movement the scale would not register a weight. [REDACTED] said he took [REDACTED] by the elbow and walked him to the bench to sit him down. [REDACTED] sat on the edge of the bench and bent over and [REDACTED] asked him if he were okay. [REDACTED] did not answer, but got down on his hands and knees and started to crawl to the scale. [REDACTED] followed and asked again if he were okay.

When [REDACTED] reached the wall near the scale he propped himself up against the wall. [REDACTED] said he then noted [REDACTED] eyes were glazed and he was taking deep breathes. [REDACTED] got [REDACTED] a cup of Gatorade from a large jug in the locker room and offered it to [REDACTED]. He put the cup to [REDACTED] lips and noticed he did appear to swallow as he could see his adam's apple moving up and down two or three times. He noticed [REDACTED] face was red and believing him to be overheated he wet a towel and placed it on his chest. [REDACTED] said he then tried to give [REDACTED] water but he would not drink.

[REDACTED] said at this point he ran down the hall to call 911. He went to the pay phone in the [REDACTED] and pushed "0" and got connected to an operator that connected him to the [REDACTED] police who advised him to hang up and dial 911. He hung up and ran back to check on [REDACTED] finding him still propped up and breathing, but the breaths were much shallower than before. [REDACTED] said he then returned to the pay phone and called 911 to request an ambulance.

[REDACTED] said he opened the gate so the responders could get in and ran back to [REDACTED]. Upon checking he thought he had stopped breathing so he began mouth to mouth resuscitation and after giving the initial breaths, [REDACTED] coughed, so [REDACTED] felt he was still breathing on his own. He stayed with [REDACTED] until he heard sirens then returned to the [REDACTED] to guide the paramedics to the locker room. Upon reaching the [REDACTED] he found a fire truck had arrived, then saw the ambulance pulling up.

[REDACTED] said the ambulance pulled into the [REDACTED] and he lead them into the locker room. The paramedics immediately began emergency breathing and inserted an IV line, having some trouble setting it. [REDACTED] said they also used the paddles (defibrillator). As they were treating [REDACTED], [REDACTED] went to the phone to call Coach [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] responded arriving before [REDACTED] was transported in the ambulance.

During the week since [REDACTED] died, various information was forwarded to this department regarding witnesses at the scene in [REDACTED]. Those leads were investigated as follows.

INTERVIEW WITH [REDACTED]

On 12-12-97, an email message was obtained through student source. The [REDACTED] was on a mail group for the [REDACTED] the message was sent by use of the computer account issued to [REDACTED] and contained considerable detail that was accurate.

The message is attached, it includes the information the the writer was present at a meeting held in [REDACTED] on 12-10-97 for [REDACTED] athletes only.

Ms. [REDACTED] was contacted on 12-17-97 at 10:15 a.m. She confirmed that she wrote the message. She said she is a member of the [REDACTED] and she was at the meeting held for [REDACTED] and the information in her email message was released at the meeting. She stated she was not in [REDACTED] when [REDACTED] collapsed and had no other source of information other than what she learned at the meeting.

INTERVIEW WITH [REDACTED] // [REDACTED]

Information was also forwarded that two members of the women's [REDACTED] may have been in [REDACTED] and saw [REDACTED] walking in the hall with Coach [REDACTED]

I contacted Coach [REDACTED] on 12-17-97 and she said she was not aware that any of her team members saw [REDACTED] on 12-09-97 and that if they had she would have learned of it. She stated the players were scheduled to practice and lift weights in [REDACTED] but she gave the team that day off.

Coach [REDACTED] agreed to inquire with the team at a meeting during the afternoon of 12-17-97. At 4:20 p.m. Captain [REDACTED] received a message from the athletic department the team members [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] saw [REDACTED] in [REDACTED] on 12-09-97.

At 8:30 p.m., I contacted [REDACTED] at her residence at [REDACTED]. She confirmed that she and [REDACTED] were in [REDACTED] on 12-09-97 and she did see [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] stated that she and [REDACTED] arrived at 5:00 p.m. and went into the weight room. Upon entering she saw three or four members of the [REDACTED] and recognized [REDACTED] as one of them. [REDACTED] said she knows some members of the team and through them learned who [REDACTED] was but did not know him personally.

 On 12-17-97, Captain [REDACTED] was advised that [REDACTED] Facilities assistant [REDACTED] had been present in [REDACTED] the evening of 12-09-97. I interviewed him at [REDACTED] at 4:24 p.m. on 12-17-97.

[REDACTED] stated that he saw [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] two times during the evening of 12-09-97. He said at approximately 7:00 p.m., he went to work out in the weight room down the hall from the [REDACTED] practice area and upon passing the sauna saw [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] sitting on the benches in the sauna.

[REDACTED] said he worked out for 40 to 45 minutes and at about 7:45 p.m., he went back and upon passing the sauna again saw them in it. He spoke to [REDACTED] to remind him to turn off the lights and the heat to the [REDACTED] area and to lock up when they were done.

[REDACTED] said that [REDACTED] looked up and he noted he was not pale or acting ill, but was red faced and sweating and added he looked like all the [REDACTED] did when they were cutting weight. He said [REDACTED] was wearing a blue sweat suit and a stocking hat. He said he had no indications that [REDACTED] was in any distress or danger or was ill.

[REDACTED] said he returned to his office, got dressed, checked for phone messages and left around 8:00 p.m.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Dr. [REDACTED] contacted this department at approximately 4:45 p.m. to advise he had signed the autopsy report one half hour earlier. He said that because of the high profile nature and media involvement of this case that release would have to be done through Dr. [REDACTED]. He added that if [REDACTED] agreed for its release through the [REDACTED] Pathology report it could be obtained through his office.

I contacted [REDACTED] an investigator for the medical examiner's office. She stated she would see Dr. [REDACTED] within an hour and would ask if the release could be expedited. At 2:56 p.m. on 12-17-97, I received a copy of the report by [REDACTED] It was faxed to this office by [REDACTED] of the Medical Examiner's office. The report is signed by [REDACTED] MD.

In the SCENE section there are blanks for the location date and time that an injury or event occurred, and in the time box the notation ~ 7 pm was written in. There is no information as to the source of that information. It should be noted that the use of the ~ symbol may mean "approximately," a common use for that symbol. This is a possible indication that the time of the onset of the illness was not clear to [REDACTED] at the time she filed the report, which is dated 12/9/97 with a time of 10:30 pm.

The text of the report also states that [REDACTED] was working out from 5:00 to about 7:00 p.m. and after working out he became dizzy, went to the locker room lied down was attended to and passed out. This information is generally attributed to the coaches in the report, however if does contain factual errors, specifically naming the coach present as Coach [REDACTED] instead of [REDACTED]

The [REDACTED] Investigator's report is included in this report with other documents from the medical examiner's office.
