

The distributor is Nutrition Express, 2575 West 237th St, Torrance, CA 90505.

The product name is "Varsity Pack 1."

The ingredients are, Vitamin A (fish liver oil), Vitamin D (fish liver oil),
Vitamin E (d-alpha tocopheryl succinate).

The text of the statement for the products containing vitamins A, D and E:

"We then transform our natural vitamin E and the other oil or fat-dispersible vitamins like A and D into a non-oily form. Why? We've discovered this predigested form is easier-to-digest. The taste of oil based vitamins won't repeat on you throughout the day and it's a superb choice for those prone to acne or oily skin."
