I know it is difficult (possibly impossible) to do your job conscientiously and at the same time please all the people. With all due respect, I suggest you strongly serve we, the people who pay you and protect us from dangers in our food and drugs. I insist on **PROMINENT LABELING** for any product containing any irradiated substance/part. Labeling must include "irradiated" or "irradiation" and the radiation symbol.


Proposed "alternative terms" such as "cold pasteurization" and "electronic pasteurization" are **UNACCEPTABLE. THEY ARE MISLEADING AND MUST NOT BE USED.**

The absence of a statement would be misleading because:

- * irradiation destroys vitamins
- * irradiation causes changes in sensory and spoilage qualities that are not obvious or expected by the consumer (who does not want it)

These regulations **MUST NOT EXPIRE** until the majority of we, the people vote for it to expire. Please, vote for **LIFE AND HEALTH**, not dollars and cents!

*** PLEASE HELP ***

The FDA is planning to remove all current labeling requirements for IRRADIATED FOOD. MAY -4 P1:47

Send a comment to the FDA

*demanding prominent labeling, the use of terms "irradiation" or "irradiated" and the use of the RADURA symbol.

*tell the FDA that you feel proposed alternative terms such as "cold pasteurization" and "electronic pasteurization are misleading and should not be used.

*say that the absence of a statement would be misleading because irradiation destroys vitamins and it causes changes in sensory and spoilage qualities that are not obvious or expected by the consumer

A general statement opposing irradiation will not help because the FDA requests comments on only two issues. 1)Whether the wording of the current radiation disclosure statement should be revised and 2)Whether such labeling requirements should expire at a specified date in the future.
