As consumers of formulary pharmaceuticals purchased from out-of-state formularies, we are vitally concerned about the proposed FDA rules which would restrict the consumers' right to choose.

In particular we object to the definition of "inordinate amount" which restricts the availability and the right to obtain medically necessary compounded medical prescriptions by limiting the number of such prescriptions that can be shipped across state lines from specialized compounding pharmacies.

Corporate pharmaceutical companies are making it ever more difficult for seniors to purchase reasonably priced prescriptions and this appears to be another such attempt to control markets.

We ask that FDA withdraw these and any similar proposed rules to restrict consumer choice.
