Dear Director Butler:

It has recently come to my attention that a former employee of my company Stone Mountain Production, Inc., Mr. Paul Creasy has filed a variance application on behalf of a company named Stone Mountain Media, LLC. I have enclosed a copy of a letter sent from your office to Mr. Paul Creasy and Stone Mountain Media, LLC dated June 27, 2005 regarding this application. I obtained this letter and following Application for a Variance document on the Internet.

In reviewing this documentation and application, I have noticed some information that may adversely affect my company, Stone Mountain Productions, Inc., Variance # 86V-0476. I would like to outline some of my concerns and I want to make sure that my company's position is not confused or put in jeopardy by this application or individual.

On Stone Mountain Media, LLC application filled out and signed by Mr. Paul Creasy as its Chief Operating Officer, Mr. Creasy lists under Section #7, PRODUCT DESCRIPTION AND USE, line (a.) specific equipment. Mr. Creasy lists an SML-PRO Series projector in this section. I would like to point out that an SML-PRO projector (Stone Mountain Lasers Projector) is one of ours (Stone Mountain Productions, Inc.) projectors.

I would also like to reference Section #13, line I, in this application which also applies to our variance and which states that "projectors will not be delivered to any other party under an agreement of sale, lease, or loan unless the recipient demonstrates that they have a variance in effect at the time of delivery". Stone Mountain Productions, Inc. never delivered any projection system to Stone Mountain Media, LLC, or Mr. Paul Creasy individually. We never sold, leased or loaned a SML-PRO projection system to Stone Mountain Media, LLC. In fact, we have never sold, leased or loaned any of our SML-PRO Series projection systems to anyone at anytime. I am concerned that if this system is misused, that my company might have some exposure.

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As an example: In the month of May, 2005, a full month before Mr. Creasy submitted the variance application on June 22, 2005, Stone Mountain Media, LLC performed a laser show for the City of Chattanooga, Tennessee and the Downtown Partnership. This show is highlighted on the Stone Mountain Media, LLC web site:

My purpose for this letter is to notify the Department and to go on the record stating that my company, Stone Mountain Productions, Inc. is not associated in any way with Stone Mountain Media, LLC, Mr. Paul Creasy or any of their productions. If Mr. Creasy is in fact in possession of an SML-PRO Series laser projector it is without our knowledge, permission or approval.
