



Dear Dr. Garnic;

To meet the FDA requirement for community consultation for research without consent as applies to the above protocol and specified under regulation 21CFR 312.60 (b)(7), I propose the following:

1. A public forum will be held Monday, September 8, 1997 at 10:00 hours in the Cancer Center auditorium for the purpose of disclosing to the public the Vest CPR Protocol including the background, exclusion criteria, risks, potential benefits, implementation, and data to be gathered. A discussion of the FDA guidelines for research without informed consent will also be provided. The public's attendance, participation and comments will be documented.
2. In anticipation of this event a public notice will be placed in Glendale News Press on Wednesday September 3, 1997. You will be provided a copy of this notice for approval prior to publication.
3. The public's comments will be provided to the IRB for review prior to application for final approval of the project.
4. On September 15, 1997 we will begin the process of training the Emergency Department staff in the use of the Vest CPR so that we would be ready to enroll as soon as the IRB approval process is complete. The anticipated study commencement date is Monday, September 22, 1997 at 07:00 hours.







**August 29, 1997, Glendale, CA** The public is invited to attend a forum at which a new method of cardiopulmonary resuscitation will be explained and demonstrated to elicit public questions and feedback. The forum will be held on Monday, September 8, at 10 a.m. in the auditorium of the Comprehensive Cancer Center of Glendale Memorial Hospital and Health Center at the corner of Eulalia Street and Central Avenue. Parking is available in the parking lot facing Laurel Street.

Glendale Memorial Hospital is proud to have been selected to be one of 14 hospitals nationwide to conduct clinical trials to evaluate **VEST-CPR<sup>®</sup>**, a form of CPR which was developed at Johns Hopkins University (JHU).

Every year more than 400,000 people in the U.S. suffer cardiac arrest. Cardiac arrest means that the heart has stopped beating. A stopped heart muscle must be restarted within minutes; otherwise, there may be irreversible brain damage or death. Manual CPR, which has been used since 1960, is only successful about 15% of the time. Tragically, 300,000 people die each year from cardiac arrest.

**VEST-CPR<sup>®</sup>** is a method which uses a vest resembling a large blood pressure cuff which is wrapped around the chest. It is connected to a computerized pneumatic system which directs compressed air into and out of the vest to compress the chest. Potential benefits are increased survival and better neurological outcomes than are now seen in manual CPR, as well as fewer and less severe internal injuries as a result of the CPR treatment. Although potential risks may not be entirely known, preliminary studies indicate that they are no higher than those experienced with manual CPR.

This study is being done in accordance with an FDA waiver of informed consent. Stuart Goldfarb, M.D., the principal investigator at this site, will explain the procedure and protocols. There will also be demonstrations of manual CPR and **VEST-CPR<sup>®</sup>** and an opportunity for the public's questions and comments.



**A New CPR Method to Be Tested  
At Glendale Memorial Hospital and Health Center**

When doctors on medical dramas heroically bring patients back to life via caridopulmonary resuscitation, what you see is not the way it usually is in real life emergency rooms. On TV dramas, CPR is more successful. In real life, CPR only succeeds 15% of the time. Each year more than 400,000 people suffer from cardiac arrest, and 300,000 die.

In an effort to improve the odds, Glendale Memorial Hospital and Health Center is one of 14 hospitals nationwide selected to participate in clinical trials to evaluate VEST-CPR<sup>®</sup>, a new way of doing CPR, developed at Johns Hopkins University (JHU).

VEST-CPR<sup>®</sup> is performed with a big vest resembling a giant blood pressure cuff wrapped around the patient's chest. It is connected to a computerized pneumatic system which directs compressed air into and out of the vest to compress the chest.

The benefits may include improved survival rates and improved neurological outcomes and reduced internal injuries. Potential risks may not be entirely known, but preliminary studies indicate that they are no higher than those from manual CPR.

In order to comply with FDA requirements of public notice before the clinical trials start (in late September). Glendale Memorial Hospital will hold a public forum in the auditorium of its Comprehensive Cancer Center on Monday, September 8, at 10 a.m. to give the public the opportunity to ask questions and express concerns.

This study is being done in accordance with an FDA waiver of informed consent. Stuart Goldfarb, M.D., the principal investigator, will explain the procedure and protocol. There will also be demonstrations of the conventional manual method and VEST-CPR.

**VEST-CPR<sup>®</sup>, a Vest That Could Save Lives, to Be Tested in Clinical Trials  
at Glendale Memorial Hospital and Health Center**

*September 8, 1997, Glendale, CA ...* Glendale Memorial Hospital and Health Center is pleased to announce that it has been chosen as one of fourteen centers in the country to participate in a study to evaluate a new way of treating cardiac arrest using cardio-pulmonary resuscitation (CPR).

Every year more than 400,000 people in the U.S. suffer cardiac arrest. Cardiac arrest means that the heart has stopped beating. A stopped heart muscle must be restarted within minutes; otherwise, there may be irreversible brain damage or death. Tragically, about 300,000 people die each year from cardiac arrest.

Today, the only treatment for restarting the heart is manual CPR. This is the technique which many of us have been taught in first aid classes or seen on television. Unfortunately, this treatment is successful only 15% of the time and is likely to cause internal injury to the patient. A new technique, called VEST-CPR<sup>®</sup> by its developer, Cardiologic Systems, Inc. of Hanover, Maryland, relies on a device invented at the Johns Hopkins University Hospital in Baltimore. This device performs the CPR chest compressions using a "Vest", resembling an oversize blood pressure cuff, around the chest. It is hoped that increased efficiency of compression and reduced internal injury to the patient as a result of the rescue effort will result in a higher percentage of patients who recover from their cardiac arrest.

Glendale Memorial Hospital and Health Center will be testing the VEST-CPR<sup>®</sup> on patients who experienced cardiac arrest in selected areas of the hospital. These patients will be treated with either conventional manual CPR, which is presently the standard of treatment, or with the VEST-CPR<sup>®</sup> device. The conditions of the study are carefully described in an FDA approved Investigational Device Exemption and will be closely supervised by the Glendale Memorial Hospital and Health Center Institutional Review


Board. The study is being conducted under a recent ruling by the FDA (November 1, 1996; 21 CFP Parts 50, 56) which allows the use of Investigational Devices in clinical trials without prior consent from patients facing an immediate life-threatening situation.

The potential benefits of the VEST-CPR<sup>®</sup> system are increased survival and better neurological outcomes from cardiac arrest than are now seen using manual CPR, and fewer and less severe internal injuries as a result of the CPR treatment. Although, potential risks may not entirely be known, preliminary studies indicate that they are no higher than those experienced with manual CPR.

VEST-CPR<sup>®</sup> is presently available for sale throughout Europe. Cardiologic Systems, Inc. hopes to complete U.S. clinical trials and the necessary regulatory requirements in order to introduce the VEST-CPR<sup>®</sup> in the U.S. by 1998.


Glendale Memorial Hospital and Health Center of Glendale, California will be one of fourteen centers in the United States conducting a study of a new, potentially life-saving treatment for patients suffering cardiac arrest. The study has been approved by the Institutional Review Board (IRB) of Glendale Memorial Hospital and Health Center. The IRB is a committee which reviews research studies to see that they are well designed with safeguards for patients and the risks are reasonable in relation to the potential benefits. Randomly selected patients suffering cardiac arrest in selected areas of the hospital will be treated with a new way of performing Cardio Pulmonary Resuscitation (CPR). The conditions of the study are carefully described in an FDA approved Investigational Device Exemption.

The new treatment, called VEST-CPR<sup>®</sup>, relies on a device invented at The Johns Hopkins University Hospital in Baltimore and developed by CardioLogic Systems, Inc., located in Hanover, Maryland. This device performs the CPR chest compressions using a "vest", resembling an oversized blood pressure cuff, around the chest. Scientific evidence indicates that the VEST-CPR<sup>®</sup> may increase the survival rate of cardiac arrest patients over manual CPR. Other expected benefits are improved neurological outcomes and reduced internal injuries. Although potential risks may not entirely be known, preliminary studies indicate that they are no higher than those experienced with manual CPR.

Patients who decide not to participate, or are not eligible to enroll in the study, will be treated with conventional CPR. Some patients may not be able to give their consent for participation in the study, due to the nature of their condition and their critical need for immediate treatment. An exception from consent, authorized by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (21 CFR 50.24), will be used when it is not feasible to obtain informed consent from the patient, a family member or a legally authorized representative. 



## NEW METHOD OF CPR GETS CLINICAL TRIALS


Unlike in the movies, not everyone can be brought back from the brink of death with cardiopulmonary resuscitation. In reality, CPR succeeds about 15% of the times it is tried.

That's why Glendale Memorial Hospital is one of 14 hospitals nationwide selected to participate in clinical trials to evaluate VEST-CPR, thought by researchers at Johns Hopkins University to be an improvement of the old way.

VEST-CPR is performed with a big vest, resembling a giant blood pressure cuff, wrapped around the patient's chest. The vest is connected to a computerized pneumatic system that directs compressed air into and out of it to compress the chest.

In order to comply with the Food and Drug Administration's requirements of public notice, the hospital will hold a public forum in the auditorium of its Comprehensive Cancer Center today at 10 a.m.



# Hospital to utilize new CPR apparatus

■ Glendale Memorial will begin using a mechanical vest on some cardiac arrest patients later this month.

By Stephanie Cain, News-Press

It looks like a blood pressure cuff on steroids and sounds like a vacuum cleaner taking off, and doctors say it could save your life.

It's called VEST-CPR, a new way of increasing blood flow during cardiac arrest, and already it shows signs of improving the 5% success rate of conventional cardiopulmonary resuscitation.

On Monday, doctors at Glendale Memorial Hospital demonstrated the technique, which they will begin using in clinical tests later in the month.

VEST-CPR works by increasing blood flow in a way that manual CPR can't, said Dr. Stuart Goldfarb, a physician at Glendale Memorial Hospital. Besides working efficiently and tirelessly, VEST-CPR's even pressure could make problems such as broken ribs and other internal injuries obsolete.

Conventional CPR falls short because it only gives the heart 5% of the blood flow it needs; the body, 25%, Goldfarb said.

VEST-CPR solves this problem with a giant gray cuff that's

whole chest cavity at timed inter-

In a 1993 study published in  
the New England Journal of

Beginning Sept. 22, VEST-






