DURING AN INSPECTION OF YOUR FIRM WE OBSERVED:

OBSERVATION 1

Failure to properly store toxic sanitizing agents in a manner that protects against contamination of food.

Specifically, we observed (b) (4) a corrosive cleaning agent stored in front of tank #3, which holds milk, a raw material for the production of finished cheese products.

OBSERVATION 2

Failure to provide sufficient space for storage of materials as necessary for the maintenance of sanitary operations and the production of safe food.

Specifically, your firm stored salt, a raw material used in the firm's finished products, on metal shelves commingled with packaging material.

Additionally, we observed approximately (b) (4) 50lb bags of salt stored on metal shelves and packaging material also stored on the same metal shelving, impeding access to the isles.

OBSERVATION 3

Effective measures are not being taken to protect against the contamination of food on the premises by pests.

Specifically, on 3/27/06 and 3/28/06 we observed the metal loading door at rear of the firm's receiving bay, with a 1/4 inch opening; the door did not form a complete seal with the floor when closed to prevent the entrance of pests.
