
The Center for Veterinary Medicine has carefully considered the potential environmental impact of this action and has concluded that this action will not have a significant effect on the quality of the human environment and that an environmental impact statement therefore will not be prepared.

Merck Sharp & Dohme has submitted an amendment to their 1983 EIAR for the original approval of ivermectin injection for cattle. The additional claims are for the treatment and control of Solenoptes capillatus and Bunostomum phlebotomum.

FDA's regulations implementing the National Environmental Policy Act, 21 CFR Part 25, have been replaced by a rule published in the Federal Register on April 26, 1985 (50 FR 16636, effective July 25, 1985). Under the new rule, an action of this type would require an environmental assessment under 21 CFR 25.31a.


