Description

This webinar is designed to aid health care professionals in understanding the different types of prescription drug labeling including patient labeling, carton and container labeling, and the prescribing information (PI) and provide an overview of the two PI formats - the Physician Labeling Rule (PLR) format and non-PLR format. The webinar will also describe the types of labeling on Drugs@FDA and DailyMed and how the labeling from these websites differ.
