Program Description

- Facilitates federal financial assistance in support of small conferences and *scientific meetings* clearly defined within the FDA mission.
- Provides funding to organizations, associations, state, local, tribal and academia.
- Award up to \$25,000
- Awarded twice a year (calendar year)
- Providing financial assistance to support various organizations allow them to meet and collaborate on current and emerging food, feed, drug and device issues impacting health and safety, which benefits the public health.
