The primary objective of this study is to demonstrate a reduction in menstrual-related pelvic pain using an extended cycle combination oral contraceptive, DP3-84/10, which utilizes ethinyl estradiol monotherapy during the otherwise hormone-free interval at the end of each cycle, compared to placebo in adolescents for the treatment of moderate to severe cyclic pelvic pain.
