On June 22, 2009, the President signed the Family Smoking Prevention and Tobacco Control Act (Tobacco Control Act) (Public Law 111-31) into law. The Tobacco Control Act granted FDA important new authority to regulate the manufacture, marketing, and distribution of tobacco products to protect the public health generally and to reduce tobacco use by minors. To carry out this responsibility, FDA established the Center for Tobacco Products (CTP).

Major Duties:

The selected employee will serve in the Office of Compliance and Enforcement's (OCE) Front Office.

Duties may include:

- Serves as liaison between FDA's Center for Tobacco Products (CTP) and Office of Regulatory Affairs (ORA) and between CTP and Center for Disease Control (CDC).
- Prepare and implement both long and short-range plans designed to meet the needs of CTP.
- Coordinates with the laboratories doing tobacco analysis for CTP to ensure compliance with regulatory requirements
- Consults with OCE senior staff members and other Center personnel to develop recommendations for regulation and policy development to address emerging issues related to new tobacco products.
- Analyze complex, legal, scientific, enforcement and other information and interpret the significance of this data under prevailing legal principles, as expressed in statutes, regulations, and case law.

Qualifying specialized experience includes:

- Knowledge of legislation, regulations, and guidance affecting FDA's Center for Tobacco Products.
- Knowledge of laboratory protocols for the analysis and testing of tobacco products.
- Solid foundation in regulatory review work.
- Excellent oral and written communication skills.

Application Procedure:

This Detail opportunity is open to qualified candidates at the GS-14 grade level and USPHS Commissioned Corps Officers.

More than one selection may be made to fill on a rotational basis.
