

My Diagnosis

- Symptoms began ~ 1/1/2012
- Diagnosed ~ 2/2012
- Discharged ~ 3/5/2012
- Symptoms partially resolved ~ 5/2012




Medication Timeline

- Fluconazole Monotherapy ~ 10/9/12
- X Itraconazole Monotherapy ~ 1/15/2013
- Voriconazole Monotherapy ~ 6/2013
- Voriconazolé and Intrathecal Amphotericin ~ 6/18/2014 (Clinically Successful, failed twice due to QOL)

Current Treatment

Posaconazole and Intrathecal Amphotericin since 12/2015

- Loss of Appetite

Ideal Outcome


- Resume Normal Life

- Length of questionnaire
