This announcement constitutes the only solicitation; quotes are being requested and a written solicitation will not be issued. This requirement is being issued in conjunction with FAR Part 13 Simplified Acquisition Procedures. This solicitation is issued as a Request for Quote (RFQ).

The associated North American Industry Classification System (NAICS) Code is 611430- Professional and Management Development Training; small business size standard is \$12,000,000 per year. This is not a small business set aside This RFQ is issued as full and open competition.

Background

The Division of Biopharmaceutics (DBP) is requesting for 12 employees to take a virtual course that focuses on Applied Risk Communication in the modern day. DBP requires an interactive course that will provide staff with the skills to design an effective risk communication message used to increase trust within the FDA.

Objective

The objective is for DBP staff to obtain knowledge and skills needed to reduce public anxiety during a global crisis such as COVID-19. Additionally, staff will learn how to apply ideas in communicating risk in a complex information environment. DBP is requesting a course or program that provides state-of-the-science knowledge on designing effective risk communication messages to improve communication, increase trust in your organization, reduce public anxiety, and help stakeholders make better decisions.

Minimum Requirements:

The Applied Risk Communication course for OPQ shall include 3-5 day, 6-8-hour sessions virtually, which shall include a group kickoff session and a group closeout session and class material (Book/eBook and homework).

Applied Risk Communication Course shall cover the following goals/objectives:

- Provide DBP staff with the understanding and skills needed to construct and deliver an effective risk communication message
- Use risk communication messages to reduce the publics anxiety, help stakeholders make the best decisions and increase trust in the FDA.
- Utilize learned information to construct a risk communication messages that uses scientific and health communications. Apply this knowledge to designing effective risk communication messages drawing on the science of strategic communication and health reporting.
