On June 22, 2009, the President signed the Family Smoking Prevention and Tobacco Control Act (Tobacco Control Act) (Public Law 111-31) into law. The Tobacco Control Act granted FDA important new authority to regulate the manufacture, marketing, and distribution of tobacco products to protect the public health generally and to reduce tobacco use by minors. To carry out this responsibility, FDA established the Center for Tobacco Products (CTP).

Major Duties:

The selected employee will serve as a Lead Consumer Safety Officer in the Office of Compliance and Enforcement (OCE) within the **Division of Enforcement and Manufacturing**.

Duties may include:

- Serve as a team leader of substantive mission-oriented programs and other project teams.
- Manage program activities including strategic planning, scheduling meetings, preparing issue-based agendas and official records of meetings, and tracking the overall status of regulatory projects.
- Provides authoritative guidance and consultation regarding inspection and investigation methods and procedures necessary to accomplish compliance/enforcement/regulatory objectives related to tobacco programs.
- Monitor and report on the status and progress of work.
- Maintain accurate records of inquiries and responses.
- Develop materials, such as slides, fact sheets, instruction documents, and other training materials.
- Drafts responses to correspondence from within and outside the agency concerning FDA regulated products.

Qualifying specialized experience includes:

- Knowledge of legislation, regulations, and guidance affecting FDA's Center for Tobacco Products.
- Solid foundation in regulatory review work.
- Excellent oral and written communication skills.
