## Introduction

The Food and Drug Administration (FDA) is the regulatory, scientific, public health and consumer protection agency responsible for ensuring all human and animal drugs, medical devices, cosmetics, foods, food additives, drugs and medicated feeds for food producing animals, tobacco and radiation emitting devices safe, and effective.

The mission of the Center for Drug Evaluation and Research (CDER) is to perform an essential public health task by making sure that safe and effective drugs are available to improve the health of people in the United States. CDER regulates over the counter and prescription drugs, including biological therapeutics and generic drugs.

The Office of Strategic Programs (OSP) is responsible for quantitative and qualitative data analysis, program evaluation, business process modernization, decision support services to facilitate effective operations, consultation to Center Offices in developing strategic and operational plans for CDER, cross-center management and coordination of work on Center-wide governance and special initiatives, and the implementation of IT solutions to meet CDER's business needs. OSP provides essential expert support and enabling services for CDER to meet its mission objectives.

The Office of Program and Strategic Analysis (OPSA) is responsible for quantitative and qualitative data analysis, business process analysis and improvement, and program evaluation to support senior management decisions. OPSA provides consultation services to Center Offices in developing and implementing proposals for key strategic initiatives and priorities, evaluating the impact of operations and policies on external stakeholders, and in conducting evaluation studies to inform Center strategy and policy position on emerging issues in drug regulation.

The position is in the Analytics and Data Service Staff (ADSS), Office of Program and Strategic Analysis (OPSA), Office of Strategic Programs, Center for Drug Evaluation and Research (CDER). ADSS serves as the Center's data expert and analytical service provider.

ADSS provides expert knowledge on a variety of CDER's data sources, including but not limited to performance metrics, for all congressional user fee reports. ADSS also uses complex and innovative causal and predictive analytical methods the wide variety of analytical problem of interest to CDER. This work necessitates the gathering and structuring of large internal and external structures and unstructured datasets, for example text scrapping/mining processes, and the development and application of appropriate statistical modeling tools and machine learning algorithms and other analytical techniques to model characteristics, activities, and to predict the behavior of those pharmaceutical sectors. Data science plays a crucial role in conducting all these activities.

## Duties/Responsibilities

As a **Data Scientist** the primary purpose in this role is to conduct and/or participate in the analyses and evaluation of program policy and operations. This work will provide a basis for, and have a direct effect on, decision affecting major center regulatory policies and programs. The incumbent will utilize tools and techniques and other appropriate analytical methodologies from disciplines, such as data science, operations research, management science, mathematics, statistics, economics, computer science, and decision science.

### Band A

- Identifies and ask the right questions to diagnose customer issues and identify root cause, collects qualitative/qualitative data, builds rules, executes techniques to extract relevant portions of the data or text, organizes key themes or trends, and prepares relevant data sets for analysis

- Creates simple, clear, and comprehensive strategies related to how data should be created, collected, stored, managed, and/or processed based on data stewardship protocol, and applies to the overarching management process

#### **Band B**

- Meets Duties and responsibilities outlined in Band A above.
- Ensures the adequacy and accuracy of the data to the extent possible, identifies relationships among data elements, and recognizes the relative significance of those relationships and their potential impact on the project.
- Communicates and collaborates with scientific and regulatory officials in FDA.
- Identifies potential shifts in programs/policies/processes strategies, goals, and/or performance metrics based on key findings and ongoing analysis (i.e., biologics, generics, and biosimilars).

#### **Band C**

- Meets Duties and responsibilities outlined in Band B above.
- Selects the appropriate techniques for qualitative and quantitative data collection for analysis, collects that data, interprets data findings, and makes recommendations to senior management
- Utilizes a variety of database management systems/organizations and/or other business intelligence reporting tool (i.e., SQL, Business Objects, and others) that control the organization, storage, retrieval, security, and integrity of data. Executes version control of scripts and data set.
- Develops benchmarks or metrics to individually conduct impact assessments and determine whether the desired outcomes were attained; developing recurring written and oral reports to the immediate supervisor, and as needed senior center management is expected, and proper documentation and storage of all work in the location designated by Office Management.
- Independently creates and facilitates the concretization, design, and conduct of quantitative studies leveraging internal and external data to inform decision making in CDER regarding operations and policy.

### **Conditions of Employment**
