#### Introduction

The Office of Policy, Legislation and International Affairs (OPLIA), Office of Global Policy and Strategy (OGPS) plans, directs, manages, and coordinates a comprehensive international program for the Food and Drug Administration (FDA). This position is located within OGPS's foreign post and is a field resource in conducting foreign inspection/investigations of the commodities regulated by the FDA. The incumbent serves as an expert in the Foreign Field

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Office for a specialty area, such as: Human and Veterinary Drugs, Medical Devices, Human and Animal Food, and Bioresearch Monitoring.

## Duties/Responsibilities

- Independently acts upon a full range of violations, including those involving emergency situations, lack of precedents or guidelines, ambiguous or dubious evidence, and/or uncooperative industry officials.
- Develops formal training programs that provide training and instruction to agency employees and State and local government personnel regarding inspection and investigative techniques; regulatory policies, standards, and requirements; and other compliance and enforcement matters.
- Serves as a foreign post focal point in conducting investigations of the most complex, controversial, and precedent setting scientific and regulatory problems involving industry practices and products within the specialty area.
- Provides expert technical guidance to management for strategic planning and program development.
- Serves on working groups to develop critical guidance for industry pertaining to the manufacture of FDA regulated products.

Supervisory Responsibilities: None

### **Conditions of Employment**

- U.S. Citizenship requirement or proof of being a U.S. National must be met by closing date.
- Employment is subject to the successful completion of a background investigation, verification of qualifications, completion of onboarding forms, submission of required documents, and any other job-related requirement before or after appointment.
- Applicants must meet all qualification requirements by the closing date of this announcement.
- Direct Deposit: You will be required to have all federal salary payments electronically deposited into a bank account with a financial institution of your choice.
- FDA participates in e-Verify: All new hires must complete the I-9 form; this information will be processed through e-Verify to determine your employment eligibility. If a discrepancy arises, you must take affirmative steps to resolve the matter.
- Males born after December 31, 1959 must be registered with the Selective Service.
- One year probationary period may be required.
- Financial Disclosure may be required.
- Ethics Clearance may be required.
- Background Investigation/Security Clearance is required. All employees must pass a security investigation. Failing to pass the background check may be grounds for removal or legal action. If hired, you may be subject to additional investigations at a later time. Top Secret Security Clearance is required for the Beijing China location and a Secret Security Clearance

- is required for the New Delhi, India location.
- This position is temporary and does not provide permanent placement upon completion or termination of the overseas assignment. Conditions may change if selectee is current FDA employee.
- Temporary/term appointments may begin stateside upon completion of security, medical and applicable trainings. Time served stateside will count towards overall appointment if selected for temporary promotion.
- Selectees for temporary/term assignments that begin stateside will remain stateside until all required clearances and trainings are completed before being deployed to an overseas location.
- A Statement of Understanding is required to be signed by the selected candidate indicating they understand the terms and conditions of this temporary appointment.

**NOTE:** For FDA employees under CURES appointment, the Center/Office has the responsibility of determining a "comparable" position for the employee upon return, if the position of record is backfilled during deployment. If there is no comparable CURES position, it is likely that the employee will not be able to return to a CURES appointment and will be returned under Title 5 at the appropriate grade, step and pay, if there is a comparable position under Title 5. "This position will be located New Delhi, India and Beijing, China. The temporary assignments not-to-exceed 2 or 3 years, but may be extended up to a total of 6 years.

### Qualifications

To be placed into a Cures position, candidates must meet the following criteria:

- 1. Scientific, Technical, and Professional Fields
- 2. Qualified and Outstanding Candidates
  - a. **Qualified** applies to all candidates for Cures appointments. The FDA OTS will use the basic requirements defined in the <u>OPM Qualification Standards</u> as a baseline for comparing experience levels and other candidate attributes for relevant positions.
  - b. **Outstanding** candidates can be defined by existing outstanding work experience, outstanding performance rating, or both.

In order to qualify for this Title 21 Cures position, the candidate(s) must meet the following <u>required</u> qualifications. Please note: Additional education and experience listed that is not indicated as <u>required</u> is preferable and desired. Candidates who do not meet the "desired" criteria will <u>not</u> be excluded from consideration for this position.

**<u>Education Requirement:</u>** Applicants must meet one of the following basic requirements:

A bachelor's or graduate/higher level degree in quality assurance or a related degree that included at least 30 semester hours in one or a combination of the following: consumer laws,

biological sciences, food science, chemistry, pharmacy, physical sciences, food technology, nutrition, medical science, engineering, epidemiology, veterinary medical science, legal investigations, law enforcement, or related scientific fields that provided knowledge directly related to consumer safety officer work.

The 30 semester hours may include up to 8 semester hours in statistics, or course work that included the principles, theory, or practical application of computers or computer programming.

OR

Combination of education and experience--courses consisting of at least 30 semester hours in the fields of study described in paragraph A above, plus appropriate experience or additional education.

<u>Desired Education</u>: There is no desired education for this position. The education requirement above must be met for consideration.

<u>Professional Experience</u>: Experience performing, evaluating, and assessing analyses and results from inspections, and determining the nature of compliance violations; Initiating appropriate regulatory action and using various scientific and technical disciplines to carry out tasks related with compliance in one of the FDA's regulated-commodities.

#### <u>Desired Professional Experience</u>:

- Familiarity with the host country's products and services that fall under assigned areas of responsibility and ability to develop and maintain professional working relationships with key U.S., national, and international stakeholders.
- Experience conducting inspections investigations, and sample collection for violations.
- Representing the organization before large public and private organized groups and meetings as a technical expert in area of specialization.
- Providing information and guidance to foreign government counterparts or entities, U.S. Federal Agencies, private industry, and universities on unique and complex regulatory issues and matters.
- Experience serving as an instructor with responsibility for providing training and instruction to acquaint lower-level trainees, agency employees, foreign regulatory counterparts and regulated industry.

## **Education Transcripts**

<u>SUBMITTING YOUR TRANSCRIPTS:</u> Positions which are scientific or technical in nature often have very specific educational requirements. A transcript is required to verify educational achievement. Pay careful attention to the Qualifications and Education sections to identify vacancies where a transcript is required. Even if you hold a similar position or are a current FDA employee, you are not exempt from transcript requirements.

## Security Clearance Requirements

Background Investigation/Security Clearance Requirements: This position requires a Top Secret security clearance for China and a Secret security clearance for India.
