## **Transformation Errors from IVD to LIS**

## **Loss of Data Meaning**



A patient with kidney disease receives a **24-hour**Urine Calcium Test.



A **24-hour** Urine Calcium Test is performed. The analyzer automatically assigns the correct code to the test.

LIVD LOINC Code:
"Calcium [Mass/volume] in 24 hour Urine"
18488-71

As the results are transferred from analyzer to the LIS, the code is incorrectly translated into to a code that represents a test performed at a single point in time.

LIS LOINC Code: "Calcium [Mass/volume] in Urine" 17862-4<sup>2</sup>









The doctor sees that the test was conducted at a single point in time rather than over a 24-hour period. Based off of that information, the doctor determines that the patient's urine calcium is elevated and orders unnecessary additional tests and increases the patient's current medication dosage.
