Introduction

The Food and Drug Administration (FDA) is the regulatory, scientific, public health and consumer protection agency responsible for ensuring all human and animal drugs, medical devices, cosmetics, foods, food additives, drugs and medicated feeds for food producing animals, tobacco and radiation emitting devices safe, and effective.

The Center for Drug Evaluation and Research (CDER) is responsible for regulating prescription

drugs, including new drugs, generic drugs, biological products and biosimilars as well as over-the-counter drugs (OTC). CDER's drug regulatory responsibilities include premarket review of new drugs and generic drugs; maintenance of the OTC drug monograph system; monitoring of all marketed drug safety and promotion activities; review, monitoring, and enforcement of drug quality during the entire drug life cycle; and ensuring drug products in the market comply with the law.

The Office of Pharmaceutical Quality (OPQ) oversees and coordinates the overall regulation of human pharmaceutical quality within CDER, including submission review, manufacturing facility assessment, and surveillance of the quality of marketed pharmaceutical products.

The Office of Biotechnology Products (OBP) serves as the OPQ's centralized regulatory resource on biotechnology drug assessment and research. OBP regulates biological products and biosimilar biological products and supports OPQ in the overall regulation of human pharmaceutical quality.

Duties/Responsibilities

As a **Review Chief**, the incumbent partners with the Division Director in providing scientific leadership and management of review, regulation, and research assuring the safety, efficacy, and quality of biological products and biosimilar biological products as specified by the PHS Act and applicable provision of the Food, Drug, & Cosmetic (FD&C) Act through their product lifecycle.

- Oversees, supervises, and manages a multi-disciplinary scientific and technical team(s) which perform risk-based product quality analyses of biological products and associated manufacturing processes.
- Provides input on Division and/or Office policies to establish standards and guidelines for biological drug product review activities.
- Provides technical oversight and guidance pertaining to the assessment of product quality, manufacturing processes, manufacturing controls, and labeling to determine whether overall product quality is assured.
- Directs the analysis and implementation of new laws and regulations that affect the Review Team and have the potential to impact changes in FDA guidance, processes, and procedures.

Supervisory Responsibilities: Manages multiple projects and provides leadership to staff of 10-12 personnel. Supervises and evaluates scientists who serve as experts in their field. Provides occupational specific technical and administrative direction and supervision 25 percent or more of the time to subordinate staff performing the work and functions of the organizational team. Executive strategic objectives for the organization. Obtains resources and identifies strategic objectives for the organization.

Conditions of Employment

- U.S. Citizenship requirement or proof of being a U.S. National must be met by closing date.

- Employment is subject to the successful completion of a background investigation, verification of qualifications, completion of onboarding forms, submission of required documents, and any other job-related requirement before or after appointment.
- Applicants must meet all qualification requirements by the closing date of this announcement.
- Direct Deposit: You will be required to have all federal salary payments electronically deposited into a bank account with a financial institution of your choice.
- FDA participates in e-Verify: All new hires must complete the I-9 form; this information will be processed through e-Verify to determine your employment eligibility. If a discrepancy arises, you must take affirmative steps to resolve the matter.
- Males born after December 31, 1959 must be registered with the Selective Service.
- One-year probationary period may be required.
- Financial Disclosure may be required.
- Ethics Clearance may be required.
- Background Investigation/Security Clearance is required. All employees must pass a security investigation. Failing to pass the background check may be grounds for removal or legal action. If hired, you may be subject to additional investigations at a later time.

Qualifications

To be placed into a Cures position, candidates must meet the following criteria:

1. Scientific, Technical, and Professional Fields
2. Qualified and Outstanding Candidates
 - a. **Qualified** applies to all candidates for Cures appointments. The FDA OTS will use the basic requirements defined in the [OPM Qualification Standards](#) as a baseline for comparing experience levels and other candidate attributes for relevant positions.
 - b. **Outstanding** candidates can be defined by existing outstanding work experience, outstanding performance rating, or both.

To qualify for this Title 21 Cures position, the candidate(s) must meet the following **required** qualifications. *Please note: Additional education and experience listed that is not indicated as required is preferable and desired. Candidates who do not meet the “desired” criteria will not be excluded from consideration for this position.*

Education Requirement:

Chemistry Series, AD-1320

- A. Degree: Physical sciences, life sciences, or engineering that included 30 semester hours in chemistry, supplemented by course work in mathematics through differential and integral calculus, and at least 6 semester hours in physics. OR
- B. Combination of education and experience – course work equivalent to a major as shown in A above, including at least 30 semester hours in chemistry, supplemented by mathematics through differential and integral calculus, and at least 6 semester hours of

physics, plus appropriate experience, or additional education.

Microbiology Series, AD-0430

- A. Degree: microbiology; or biology, chemistry, or basic medical science that included at least 20 semester hours in microbiology and other subjects related to the study of microorganisms, and 20 semester hours in the physical and mathematical sciences combining course work in organic chemistry or biochemistry, physics, and college algebra, or their equivalent. OR
- B. Combination of education and experience – courses equivalent to a major in microbiology, biology, chemistry, or basic medical science that included courses as shown in A above, plus appropriate experience or additional education.

General Natural Resources Management and Biological Sciences Series, AD-0401

- A. Degree: biological sciences, agriculture, natural resource management, chemistry, or related disciplines appropriate to the position. OR
- B. Combination of education and experience – courses equivalent to a major, as shown in A above, plus appropriate experience or additional education.

Desired Professional Experience:

Our ideal candidate will possess:

- Knowledge of enforcing laws and regulations to protect consumers from drugs that are defective, dangerous, impure, unwholesome, ineffective, or improperly or deceptively labeled or packaged.
- Knowledge of regulatory assessment process and project management skills.
- Demonstrated ability to identify the internal and external politics that impact the work of the organization. Perceives organizational and political reality and acts accordingly.
- Knowledge and experience in organizational change management.
- Ability to communicate verbally and in writing, and work with staff at all levels of the organization and varying levels of domain expertise. Excellent listening skills and a commitment to communicate in a timely manner.
- Ability to work independently and as a contributing and collaborative team member.
- Ability to organize time effectively, determine priorities, and move work forward.

Education Transcripts

SUBMITTING YOUR TRANSCRIPTS: Positions which are scientific or technical in nature often have very specific educational requirements. A transcript is required to verify educational achievement. Security Clearance Requirements

Background Investigation/Security Clearance Requirements: Non-Sensitive/High Risk

A background security investigation will be required for all appointees. Appointment will be subject to the applicant's successful completion of a background security investigation and favorable adjudication. In addition, if hired, a background security investigation or supplemental investigation may be required later.
