Narrative Report

Dr. Nancy Rigotti is an academic general internist on the faculty of Harvard Medical School and the Massachusetts General Hospital, where she has practiced primary care and been an investigator, teacher, mentor, and administrator since completing her residency in primary care internal medicine. She trained in clinical epidemiology in a general internal medicine research fellowship. Dr. Rigotti is Associate Chief for Academic Advancement in the Division of General Internal Medicine, Department of Medicine at Massachusetts General Hospital. She served as President of the Society of General Internal Medicine, academic general internal medicine's professional society, in 2009-2010, and was awarded the rank of Master of the American College of Physicians, internal medicine's largest professional society, in 2020.

Within internal medicine, Dr. Rigotti's research, teaching, and clinical innovations focus on tobacco use, the leading preventable cause of death in the U.S. and worldwide. Her work aims to reduce smoking prevalence and thereby reduce the burden of tobacco-related morbidity and mortality. Her approach is multidisciplinary, combining efforts to change individuals' smoking behavior with actions at the health care system, community and policy levels. Since 1979, Dr. Rigotti has advocated for physicians to take a more active role in treating their patients' tobacco use. She helped to develop clinical strategies that physicians now use to treat tobacco use and she was a pioneer in training physicians to use these methods. Increasingly her work aims to implement system-level interventions to ensure the equitable delivery of tobacco treatment throughout health care systems and communities. Her work has been recognized by the Society of General Internal Medicine's John M. Eisenberg National Award for Career Achievement in Research (its highest research award) and by the American College of Physicians' James D. Bruce Memorial Award for Distinguished Contributions in Preventive Medicine. In recognition of her expertise, Dr. Rigotti was invited by the American College of Cardiology to co-lead its 2018 *Smoking Cessation Expert Consensus Decision Pathway*. She has

written invited state-of-the-art clinical reviews of tobacco cessation treatment by leading medical journals such as the *New England Journal of Medicine* in 2002 and *JAMA* in 2022.

To further this work, Dr. Rigotti founded and directs Massachusetts General Hospital's multi-disciplinary Tobacco Research and Treatment Center, which combines clinical service with a research group that develops and tests tobacco cessation treatment interventions, primarily but not exclusively in health care settings that include hospitalization, primary care practice, prenatal care, oncologic care, and pediatric practice. Dr. Rigotti and her mentees have conducted randomized clinical trials to identify effective smoking cessation strategies in these settings and then translate the findings into routine clinical practice. She has extended these efforts to promote the delivery of tobacco cessation treatment in marginalized populations with a disproportionately high prevalence of tobacco use and tobacco-attributable mortality, such as people who live with HIV, are homeless, and have other substance use disorders. She has also expanded her work to promote the delivery of evidence-based tobacco cessation treatment in low and middle-income countries (India and South Africa).

The MGH Tobacco Research and Treatment Center has also conducted clinical trials of new smoking cessation pharmacotherapies including Phase 2 and 3 trials of bupropion, varenicline, and an investigational nicotine vaccine. Dr. Rigotti is now evaluating cytisine, a plant-based alkaloid used in Eastern Europe that has the potential to be an affordable globally-available tobacco cessation aid. She was Principal Investigator for a recently-completed large U.S. Phase 3 randomized clinical trial that tested cytisine's efficacy and safety for smoking cessation and was done to support a possible future application for the product's licensure by the FDA as a smoking cessation aid.

Over the past 5 years, Dr. Rigotti broadened her portfolio to assess the benefits and risks of electronic cigarettes. She served on the National Academies of Science, Engineering, and Medicine committee that produced the landmark report, *Public Health Consequences of E-Cigarettes* in 2018. She advises Health Canada as a member of the Tobacco Control Board's Scientific Advisory Board for Vaping Products. Her own e-cigarette research has addressed on the devices' potential to promote smoking cessation and harm reduction especially in populations of smokers who have difficulty stopping combustible tobacco use, such as individuals with chronic medical diseases or other substance use disorders. She is also studying potential interventions to promote cessation of e-cigarette use by young adult e-cigarette users.

At the public health level, Dr. Rigotti has assessed tobacco control public policies and done survey research to assess tobacco use nationwide. As Associate Director of the Institute for the Study of Smoking Behavior and Policy at Harvard's Kennedy School of Government from 1985-1990, she conducted some of the first evaluations of no-smoking laws and policies. Her work illustrated the feasibility and acceptability of these laws and their effect on smoking behavior. She led the first controlled evaluation of efforts to reduce youth access to tobacco, whose results led to a re-examination of the wisdom of this tobacco control strategy. Another paper called attention to an increase in tobacco use by U.S. college students in the 1990s. This work brought the previously unrecognized problem of young adult smoking to the attention of the public health community, led to the development of new interventions, and was used nationwide to support policy changes in colleges and communities. Dr. Rigotti was also a Scientific Editor of the 1989 Surgeon General's Report on Tobacco, a comprehensive widely-cited review of the evidence that provided scientific support for policymaking for over a decade.

Dr. Rigotti's leadership in tobacco research was recognized by election as President (2003-2004) of the Society for Research in Nicotine and Tobacco, the international professional society for research in this field, and by appointment as Deputy Editor of the journal *Nicotine & Tobacco Research*. Locally, she chaired the Tobacco Task Force (a system-wide quality improvement team) for the Mass General

Brigham Health Care System. In that capacity, she helped to implement tobacco treatment systems across all hospitals and conducted pilot trials of new strategies to integrate tobacco treatment into inpatient and outpatient health care. She also directs a smoking cessation program offered to employees of Mass General Brigham, Massachusetts' largest private employer.

Dr. Rigotti has a long record of mentoring many trainees with diverse professional backgrounds. She and received (and renewed) a K24 grant from NHLBI to support this work. She was the Massachusetts General Hospital site co-Director for the Harvard Medical School General Medicine Fellowship from 2007-2019. Since 2017 she has co-directed the MGH Career Development Program in Substance Use and Addiction Medicine, a NIDA-funded K12 training program that aims to prepare scholars to become independent investigators. Dr. Rigotti has had a major role in teaching preventive medicine at Harvard Medical School. She was Course Director of the Preventive Medicine and Nutrition course from 1990, when it first became a 2nd year core course, until 2006. For this work, she received the 2004 F. Marion Bishop Educator of the Year Award from the Association for Prevention Teaching and Research.

A second focus of Dr. Rigotti's clinical, educational, and research activity is women's health and women's careers in medicine. From 2010-2020 she served as Director of MGH's Office of Women's Careers whose mission is to promote the advancement of female faculty members across all hospital department. Her early research was in eating disorders. In 1984, she published the first study to identify osteoporosis as a complication of anorexia nervosa. This and subsequent papers established the natural history of this complication and helped to launch a new area of investigation.
