Introduction

The Food and Drug Administration (FDA) is the regulatory, scientific, public health and consumer protection agency responsible for ensuring all human and animal drugs, medical devices, cosmetics, foods, food additives, drugs and medicated feeds for food producing animals, tobacco and radiation emitting devices safe, and effective.

The mission of the Center for Drug Evaluation and Research (CDER) is to perform an essential public health task by making sure that safe and effective drugs are available to improve the health of people in the United States. CDER regulates over the counter and prescription drugs, including biological therapeutics and generic drugs.

The mission of the Office of Surveillance and Epidemiology (OSE) is to detect, assess, prevent, and manage the risks of medications so that they can be relied upon to treat disease and improve health using four core functions: Pharmacovigilance, Pharmacoepidemiology, Risk Management, Medication Error Prevention and Analysis.

The mission of the respective divisions in the Office of Pharmacovigilance and Epidemiology (OPE) is to protect the public using epidemiologic evidence to assess the safety and effectiveness of drugs and biologics by detecting, assessing, and evaluating the safety and effectiveness of drugs and biologics using observational methods; and conducting drug and biologic safety and effectiveness surveillance and research using the best available epidemiologic methodologies. This position is in the Division of Epidemiology I (DEPI I), Office of Pharmacovigilance and Epidemiology (OPE), Office of Surveillance and Epidemiology (OSE), Center for Drug Evaluation and Research (CDER).

Duties/Responsibilities

As a **Lead General Health Scientist**, the incumbent is responsible for serving as advisor planning, coordinating, and evaluating drug safety and effectiveness programs and activities to assess risk and treatment effect using real-world data.

- Reports to the supervisor on team and individual work accomplishments, problems, and work processes.
- Coordinates team initiatives and policy implementation. Prepares reports and maintains records of work accomplishments and supporting information. Represents the team in dealings with the supervisor and manager to obtain resources and secure information for decisions.
- Applies a wide range of qualitative and quantitative methods to analyze and improve team effectiveness. Leads the team in assessing its strengths and weaknesses; resolves simple and informal complaints of employees and refers others to an appropriate management official.
- Maintains close personal contact with the “state of the science” in order to inculcate the most advanced theories and practices in the programs.
- Serves as a recognized authority in the area of scientific expertise, receives for resolution unique, far-reaching, and previously unresolved problems.
- Provides consultations, opinions, and endorsements regarding the area of regulatory expertise and attends meetings both within and outside the Federal government.
- Addresses professional groups, such as Pharmaceutical Research and Manufacturers of America (PhRMA) Foundation and Advanced Medical Technology Association (AdvaMed), on the area of regulatory expertise as that area affects the mission for which the Division/Staff is responsible.

Team Leader Functions:

- Leads a team of a minimum of four.
- Ensures that the organization's strategic plan, mission, vision, and values are communicated and integrated into the team's strategies, goals, objectives, and work.
- Articulates and communicates to the team the assignment, project, problem to be solved, actionable events, milestones, and/or program issues under review, and deadlines and time frames for completion.
- Coaches the team in the selection and application of appropriate problem-solving methods and techniques, provides advice on work methods, practices, and procedures, and assists the team and/or individual members in identifying the parameters of a viable solution.
- Leads the team in identifying, distributing, and balancing workload and tasks among employees in accordance with established workflow, skill level and/or occupational specialization; adjusting the workload in accordance with established priorities to ensure timely accomplishment of assigned team tasks and ensures that each employee has an integral role in developing the final team product.
- Provides input on the training needs of team members and works with division management to arrange specific administrative and/or technical training to accomplish tasks or projects.
- Monitors and reports on the status and progress of work, checking on work in progress and reviewing completed work to see that the supervisor's instructions on work priorities, methods, deadlines, and quality have been met.
- Serves as facilitator in coordinating team initiatives and in consensus building activities among team members.
- Maintains current knowledge to answer questions from team members on procedures, policies, and directives, etc.
- Facilitates problem solving methods and techniques within team.

Conditions of Employment

- U.S. Citizenship requirement or proof of being a U.S. National must be met by closing date.
- Employment is subject to the successful completion of a background investigation, verification of qualifications, completion of onboarding forms, submission of required documents, and any other job-related requirement before or after appointment.
- Applicants must meet all qualification requirements by the closing date of this announcement.
- Direct Deposit: You will be required to have all federal salary payments electronically deposited into a bank account with a financial institution of your choice.
- FDA participates in e-Verify: All new hires must complete the I-9 form; this information will be processed through e-Verify to determine your employment eligibility. If a discrepancy arises, you must take affirmative steps to resolve the matter.

- One-year supervisory probationary period may be required.
- Financial Disclosure may be required.
- Ethics Clearance may be required.
- Background Investigation/Security Clearance is required. All employees must pass a security investigation. Failing to pass the background check may be grounds for removal or legal action. If hired, you may be subject to additional investigations at a later time.

 - b. **Outstanding** candidates can be defined by existing outstanding work experience, outstanding performance rating, or both.

This degree must be from an educational program from an accrediting body recognized by the [U.S. Department of Education](#) at the time degree is obtained.

Desired Professional Experience:

Our ideal candidate will possess:

- Knowledge of the FDA Amendments Act, and the regulations and policies promulgated under that statute.
- Advanced knowledge of science (e.g., biology, regulatory science, drug safety,

pharmacoepidemiology).

- Demonstrated ability to clearly communicate orally and in writing.
- Skill in working with a variety of people at all levels. Demonstrated ability to develop networks and build alliances; collaborates across boundaries to build alliances, collaborates across boundaries to build strategic relationships, and achieve common goals.
- Skill in planning, organizing, and leading the work of other professional staff.

Education Transcripts
