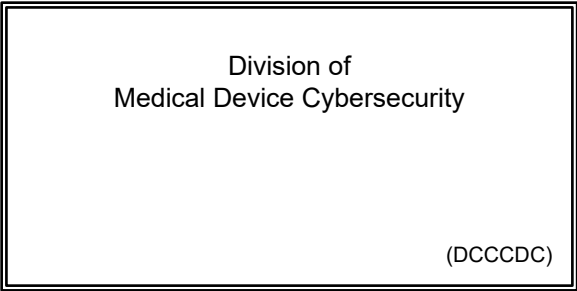
1. Division of Medical Device Cybersecurity (DCCDC).

- A. Leads and collaboratively advances the cybersecurity posture of the Healthcare and Public Health (HPH) critical infrastructure medical device ecosystem via a total product lifecycle (TPLC) approach, furthering the development and implementation of policy and strategic engagements.
- B. Advances national preparedness, response and coordination for cybersecurity incidents involving medical devices by enhancing collaborations, optimizing operational responsiveness, and leveraging the Center for Devices and Radiological Health regulatory science capabilities via an integrated approach.

2. Authority and Effective Date.

The functional statements for the Division of Medical Device Cybersecurity were approved by the Secretary of Health and Human Services on June 27, 2023, and effective on August 8, 2023.
