

**STATEMENT OF AUTHORITY
AND
CONFIDENTIALITY COMMITMENT FROM
THE COLLEGE OF PHARMACISTS OF BRITISH COLUMBIA
NOT TO PUBLICLY DISCLOSE NON-PUBLIC INFORMATION SHARED
BY UNITED STATES FOOD AND DRUG ADMINISTRATION**

The United States Food and Drug Administration (FDA) is authorized to disclose non-public information to the College of Pharmacists of British Columbia (CPBC) as part of cooperative law enforcement or cooperative regulatory activities.

FDA understands that some of the information it receives from CPBC may include non-public information exempt from public disclosure under the laws and regulations of British Columbia, Canada, which is confidential commercial information; trade secret information; personal privacy information; law enforcement information; designated national security information; or internal, pre-decisional information. CPBC understands that this non-public information is shared in confidence and that FDA considers it critical that CPBC maintain the confidentiality of the information and further that CPBC use it only for investigation and enforcement of laws under which CPBC has a statutory responsibility therefor. Public disclosure of this information by CPBC could seriously jeopardize any further scientific and regulatory interactions between FDA and CPBC. FDA hereby advises CPBC that the information that will be disclosed to CPBC hereunder is non-public information and is disclosed in confidence.

Therefore, CPBC certifies that it:

1. has the authority to protect from public disclosure such non-public information provided to CPBC in confidence by FDA;
2. will not publicly disclose such FDA-provided non-public information without the written authorization of FDA or the written authorization from the individual who is the subject of the personal privacy information, or a written statement from FDA that the information no longer has non-public status;
3. will inform FDA promptly of any effort made by judicial or legislative mandate to obtain FDA-provided non-public information from CPBC and CPBC will take all appropriate legal measures in an attempt to protect the information from disclosure, and, if such judicial or legislative mandate orders disclosure of FDA-provided non-public information, CPBC will take all appropriate legal measures in an effort to ensure that the information will be disclosed in a manner that protects the information from public disclosure and from any disclosure or use inconsistent with the purpose for which FDA has disclosed it to CPBC as described above; and

4. will promptly inform FDA of any changes to British Columbia's laws or regulations, or to any relevant policies or procedures, that would affect CPBC's ability to honor the commitments in this document.
