Is it any wonder that this abuse of drugs has rendered certain pathogens immune to antibiotics?

We are spending millions of dollars to fight outbreaks of food poisoning and to upgrade meat and seafood inspections. But on-farm problems which cause illness need to be addressed, such as overcrowding, feeding of animal parts and animal waste.

The FDA should not allow antibiotics used for human medicine to be used in livestock feed.

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
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
