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**SUMMARY**

This initial targeted egg safety inspection of a shell egg producer was conducted in accordance with FDA PHI-DO FY 11 work plan per “FY 11 Inspection of Egg Farms for Monitoring Compliance with Egg Safety Rule” amended February 8, 2011, DFIG Assignment # 11-04, ORA Concurrence # 2011012601, FACTS # 1258067 and OPID 5438766.

On 26 MAY 2011, LT Mastalski and I (Brandi L. Garbutt) presented our credentials and issued an FDA-482, Notice of Inspection to Roger F. Slaughbaugh, Farm Manager, and most responsible individual present at the initiation of the current inspection.

The firm employs approximately (b) (4) individuals.

There are no previous FDA inspections.

The current inspection revealed that Eggs Newburg produces shell eggs primarily for the table market. This inspection included a walkthrough and record review. The farm operates two egg laying poultry house.

Rodent index logs and flock testing results were reviewed; no significant deviations were observed.

No refusals were encountered.

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No samples were collected.

On 26 MAY 2011, LT Mastalski and I (Brandi L. Garbutt), presented credentials and issued an FDA-482, Notice of Inspection, to Roger F. Slaughbaugh, Farm Manager. Mr. Slaughbaugh identified himself as the most responsible individual at the facility. Ron Ballew, Environmental Compliance Manager, and [REDACTED], Nutritionist, were also present during the inspection. Mr. Ballew and [REDACTED] answered questions related to the inspection.

**HISTORY**

A positive environmental salmonella sample was associated with the last flock in House #1 and the current flock in House #2. Egg testing was performed and all samples were negative. The firm is involved with the United Egg Producers (UEP) cooperative and SQF (Safe Quality Foods).

The firm employs [REDACTED] employees.

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**INTERSTATE COMMERCE AND JURISDICTION**

The farm produces shell eggs for the table market. According to Mr. Ballew, approximately (b) (4) cases are produced weekly. Approximately (b) (4) of the eggs are distributed in interstate commerce. Eggs are distributed to (b) (4). All eggs produced at this facility are marketed by (b) (4).

**INDIVIDUAL RESPONSIBILITY AND PERSONS INTERVIEWED**

Roger F. Slaughbaugh, Farm Manager, is the owner of the farm. Mr. Slaughbaugh provided administrative information. He has the power to detect and correct deficiencies.

**MANUFACTURING/DESIGN OPERATIONS**

The firm is registered with FDA under registration #27869156302. The firm's P number is 1125 (PA). (b) (4) owns the birds. (b) (4) packs the eggs and provides all of the feed. All chicks are on the NPIP program which certifies they are SE clean. Exhibit #1 is a copy of the firm's SE Plan.

House 2: (b) (4) birds, (b) (4) weeks old

There are (b) (4) birds per cage. All birds are (b) (4).

**Feed and Water:**

The feed contains (b) (4). Poultry is fed by a (b) (4). The water source is well water and it is supplied through a (b) (4) watering system. House #1 is (b) (4) are utilized for House #2.

**House and Building:**

House #1 (b) (4) sq. ft) is a (b) (4) house with (b) (4) rows and (b) (4) tiers. House #2 ((b) (4) sq. ft) is a (b) (4) house with (b) (4) rows and (b) (4) tiers. The firm utilizes a common egg belt that leads into the production facility. There is approximately 100 feet between each house. All visitors are required to suit up before entering the chicken houses. The firm utilizes a dry clean and disinfection after the birds are removed. Dead birds are collected (b) (4) and stored in a freezer. Dead birds are picked up for rendering (b) (4).

**Pest Control:**

For rodent control, the firm utilizes (b) (4) stations, and (b) (4) inside and outside of the houses. For fly control, the firm utilizes (b) (4) per poultry house. No deficiencies were noted.

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**REFUSALS**

No refusals were encountered.

**GENERAL DISCUSSION WITH MANAGEMENT**

Mr. Ron Ballew, Environmental Compliance Manager, and [REDACTED], Nutritionist, were present during the discussion with management.

1. The firm did not record farm name/address and the time that operations were performed on rodent and pest control records.

*Discussion with Management Response: Mr. Ballew and [REDACTED] agreed to correct the records for future use to include time, date, and initials of personnel performing the operation.*


